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Personal Safety Online

We want an internet where we're free to.....I thought we could focus on having fun on the internet but staying safe.

Think about one area of online safety that you would like to tell a younger person about, in order to keep themselves safe online whilst enjoying the many benefits there are. Produce a 6-12 frame story board, or you can do a 2-minute film with your phone to get the message across for the young person you're aiming it at.

What will your message be? EG. It's okay to have fun playing with friends online but don't invite people you don't know to join your group game, Why? **Things to think about when online:** You may wish to use one of these areas for your message or you may have your own idea.

- **Cyberbullying-** is using online technology to hurt someone on purpose. **Examples of cyberbullying** include sending hurtful texts or instant messages. Block it and tell an adult.
- **Your Digital Footprint** is the information and data you've shared and stored on devices and online they can tell a story about who you are. More than that, there's a digital trail that unknowingly every time we log on.
- **Downloading** always check with an adult before- to make sure safe, viruses etc.
- **Friends:** Are they real friends, have you actually met them before? Is it alright to meet up with someone you meet online?
- **Ghost setting** you can literally see where all of your friends are and what they're doing. And when I say you can see where they are, I'm talking yes, exact location
- **Online Grooming** is where someone befriends a child online and builds up their trust with the intention of exploiting them and causing them harm.
- **Passwords and pins** keep these private to you (parents allowed).
- **Photos** posting photo's/sharing. You cannot take it back, and once posted it leaves a footprint.
- **Privacy Settings** security, are you protected or can anyone look at everything you have posted.
- **Sexting** is sending sexually explicit messages, photos, or video via cell phone, computer, or any digital device. ... Sexting is often done as a joke, a way of getting attention, or as flirting. You can **never** take it back, it's out there forever.
- **Video chat and web chats** immediately close the **chat** and report it if someone is doing or saying inappropriate things to you. Don't accept **chat** requests from non-friends. Use a secure password for your **video chat** account that's hard for others to guess. Then keep it to yourself.
